### 1) CALL TO ORDER:

• Tom Kelly called the meeting to order at 8:31 AM

# 4) APPROVE AGENDA:

# 5) APPROVE MINUTES:

• Rod motioned to approve the March meeting minutes, Steve seconded, all approved, motion carried

# 7) TREASURER REPORT AND PAY CLAIMS:

- P&L, balance sheet and budget for February and March were reviewed by the board
- Rod motioned to approve the February financials, Tom seconded, all approved, motion carried
- Steve motioned to approve the March financials, Ed seconded, all approved, motion carried

### 8) LONG TERM PLAN:

- Long Range Plan Update 2017 / Mork & Kelly
  - Tom distributed the long range plan proposal prior to the meeting via email. Need to update in 2017 and finish in 2018. This needs to be current and complete. Bill noted via email that we cannot just update the old plan. It's logical to contract Cheryl again.
  - Citizens should be heavily involved in the process.
  - Need to create and distribute surveys to residents. Can use last version as a base.
  - Estimated expense is just over \$10000.00. We will request a grant it will fund up to 67% of the cost.

### 9) WATER RUNOFF PROGRAM

- Water Quality
  - East Balsam Study / McGlynn
    - Need to repeat probe. It got buried late last year so needs to be repeated this year. Ray has a boat on the water and can take the probe out.
    - Ray Rod and Ray discussed East Balsam needs with Land and Water relating to drainage needs on the basin. Jeremy Williamson (Land & Water) is putting together a cost menu of options by May. Need to also get a cost from Bill James (other contact) for comparison. Studies are done by basin so East Balsam covers only that basin.
    - Tom asked what we are trying to determine. Ed and Rod: How much phosphorous and when over the years – is it due to human activity or just how the lake is. This study would be a 4 part process.
    - Tom –as part of the St Croix watershed, some information is already available.
    - Ray we are looking at spending a lot of money on East Balsam which is an impaired body of water, and need to understand cause and sources before spending money on corrective measures. Need a watershed study before recommending a solution to the constituents.
  - # HAB Aquatics Alum Presentation
    - Cedar Lake Alum Treatment will begin this year. Ability to watch how successful that effort is will be valuable to see. Short term to see results is a 3 year time period. Noted that the Alum treatment in Wapogasset was not

successful because there was too much flowage and possibly because the treatment was too light.

- HAB said in their presentation that this is really only a 7-10 year solution.
  Ray noted he's heard it can be 7-10, 10-30, or permanent depending on the lake and situation.
- Rod noted if we can identify and minimize the cause, it will help us determine how long it is likely to last. Flow monitor in the stream on the north side of the lake would help identify how much flowage and how much phosphorous is coming in from there.
- Ed noted understanding the full impact watershed study is important before deciding what to do.
- Over 30 micrograms affect the lake. East Balsam is over 40.
- Steve noted salt runoff affects the fish species in the lake.
- Sedimentation Dredging / Preble
  - Still working on it. We don't know yet whether Dale came out to take pictures yet. Rod will call him this weekend to set up a time. Rod still trying to reach Thomas Kay to see if pumping is an option. Otherwise it will be 2 bags a year. Possibly trying to submit the permit before the annual meeting but this cannot be rushed. May want to get the DNR involved in the prepermit process.
- Healthy Lakes Native Plantings / Kelly
  - $\circ$   $\;$  We did get the grant. Tom will work with Harmony Environmental on that.
  - 32 applicants. Room for 25 if each maximizes the dollars. Will be based on the date the application came in. Some people will fall out so more applicants will be addressed.
  - Harmony Environmental will begin site inspections in May to see which sites qualify. They will make initial recommendations.
- Aquatic Plant Management
  - CLP treatment / Sloss-Preble
    - $\circ$   $\;$  Waiting for the permit. Amy is ready to send notifications.
    - Water temp is 46-47 degrees. Still too early. Matt has pushed date back to beginning of May based on water temp.
  - CBCW / Sloss
    - No Change. Applications need to be discussed before putting on the website.
      Disclosures came from the Polk County information. Should be ready this week.
  - Harvester / Preble
    - Truck done, Harvester will begin preparation for use in the next few weeks. Should be put in the first or second week in May.
    - # Harvester Building
      - Looking for ways to reduce the bid. Rod got some other information. Bids are 31k, 36k, 41k based on buying from Menards and possibly

going with other construction companies. Cost to move electric pole and cement not included in any of the bids.

- o # Lease with City
  - Waiting on slight lease change but almost done
- AIS Rapid Response
  - Budgeting for this year, need to increase potential budget item. Consider allocating a portion of liquidity to fund AIS and Rice Creek
- Conservancies
